

Multiculturalism

The course introduces theoretical fundamentals and the practical manifestation of multiculturalism in modern society. Multiculturalism as a socio-cultural phenomenon is not only an inevitable aspect of growing globalisation but it also plays a role of intellectual and practical appeal in everyday life.

The course is structured according to several methodological points of view: first in a chronological order that familiarises students with the historical development of multiculturalism as social policy; secondly the ontological aspect which explains multiculturalism as a political and ethical model, and lastly a methodical approach which focuses on analysis of particular evidence of multiculturalism in different spheres of social reality (politics, social practice, education and upbringing, art etc).
